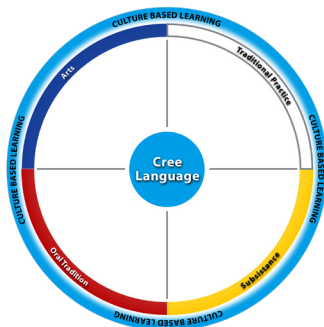

Grade 5 Social Studies: Time and Place

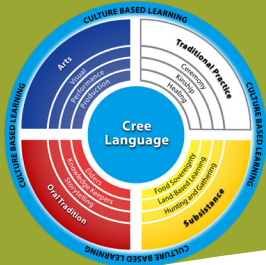
Students examine ancient civilizations.
